Several HoG staff members speak Spanish. They'll be glad to help you communicate with the group. Please let us know in advance if you are worried about language issues – we'll do what we can to help you feel comfortable. This also applies when an HoG nurse or social worker is scheduled to visit your home. They can bring a translator with them when needed.
