These are hard times for many people, but we hope things will look up soon. United Way is an organization that serves as a clearinghouse for agencies that provide some assistance to those in need. United Way serves metropolitan Atlanta and also has branches in north and south Georgia. You can call 404-614-1000 to find out about places in your area where you might be able to get assistance. If you are calling from a telephone land line, simply call "211." If you live in one of the metro counties, you can go on line at www.unitedwayatlanta.org and click on "2-1-1."
